

The High Adventure Team is offering 7 courses in 2011-2012.

Each of the specialized training courses builds from the foundation gained by completion of the "HAT CORE". Completion of the HAT Core course (or having an existing HAT number) is a prerequisite for all other courses. Those attending the specialized training (BBA, Okpik, Paddle Sports, Cycling Awareness, Climbing Instructor Awareness, or Wilderness First Aid) will be expected to have the skills required to attain the merit badges for these activities prior to the course.



What is High ADVENTURE?

BSA defines High Adventure in many ways. Essentially any activity designed for older boys and girls that involves adventure challenges or wilderness experience (afloat or afoot), or may include high altitude, extreme weather conditions, cold water, exposure, fatigue, and/or remote conditions where readily available medical care cannot be assured.

HAT Core

This course provides the foundation for all other HAT courses. It is open to all registered Scouting adults who have completed the Position Specific Training for a Scout Master or Assistant Scoutmaster (including the Introduction to Outdoor Leaders Skills). It covers the common skills and techniques required for any High Adventure Activity and focuses on the skills and knowledge required for planning and leading a successful, safe and enjoyable backpacking trek. Course topics include: **Planning & Leadership, Basic Equipment, Wilderness Navigation, Food, Wilderness Safety, and Leave No Trace.** A HAT (High Adventure Team) number will be issued to adults upon successful completion of this course. Course topics include: **Planning & Leadership, Types of Paddling, Equipment, Safety, Orienting the Paddler, Paddling Strokes & Techniques, Maneuvers, River Reading and Running as they relate to Paddle Sports Awareness.** This course is open to all registered Scouting adults who have completed the HAT Core course, have a current certification in Safe Swim Defense and Safety Afloat, and can pass the swimming test. **YOU MUST BRING PROOF OF CURRENT COMPLETION IN BOTH SAFE SWIM DEFENSE AND SAFETY AFLOAT to the Course. Wilderness First Aid and CPR

Wilderness First Aid is a practical, 16 hour (20 with CPR) course that prepares you to recognize and avoid wilderness hazards, and perform first aid outdoors with whatever equipment you have or can improvise. Wilderness First Aid Certification by the American Safety & Health Institute (www.ashinstitute.com) is valid for 3 years, CPR for 1 year.
